INTRODUCTION

This directory provides a listing of both prevention resources as well as a description of service providers. We hope this resource directory for the Central Ohio area will assist you in locating the services you are seeking. It should not be taken as an endorsement of any one provider. We encourage you to decide for yourself whether a provider is appropriate for you and your situation. Should you have feedback, questions, concerns or a need not met by the directory please do not hesitate to call the Central Ohio Case Management Network Coordinator at **614-299-2437, extension 125**. The Network Coordinator maintains an office at the Columbus AIDS Task Force, but works with agencies throughout Central Ohio.

The Central Ohio Case Management Network is made up of social work Case Managers from the following agencies: the Columbus Public Health, the Columbus AIDS Task Force, Southeast Inc., and the Licking County AIDS Task Force. These four agencies have case managers who specialize in HIV/AIDS care and services. The Network serves a seven county area (Delaware, Fairfield, Franklin, Licking, Madison, Pickaway and Union). Case Managers visit each of these counties on a regular basis. Case managers can assist clients in accessing a variety of benefits and services in their communities ranging from medical care to housing assistance. To request a Case Manager or information about case management and other services, call 614-299-2437 and ask to speak to the on call case manager.

The Central Ohio HIV Consortium is made up of consumers, advocates, service providers and others concerned with HIV/AIDS care in Central Ohio. The Consortia meets monthly to address service issues and the needs of persons living with HIV/AIDS. The consortium helps oversee the Ryan White Emergency Assistance Program and the Case Management Network and promotes coordination and integration of community resources. Meetings are the third Wednesday of the month at Columbus Public Health (240 Parsons Ave.), room 119 C from 1 – 3 pm. Call for February, June and October's meeting location and time. The Columbus Regional Advisory Group (CRAG) oversees the use of Federal HIV Prevention Grant dollars awarded to the Columbus region much in the same way as the Ryan White Consortia 2 oversees the use of Federal CARE Act dollars. Meetings are the third Tuesday of the month at the Columbus Public Health, room 119 C from 5 – 7 pm. The Ryan White Care Act is a federal financial assistance program for people living with HIV/AIDS who are experiencing an HIV related emergency. In Columbus and Central Ohio, Network Case Managers assist eligible clients having an HIV-related emergency in accessing a variety of services such as: Medical Care, Dental Care, Lab Work, Nutrition, Housing, Transportation, Family Services, Rehabilitation, and Home Health Care. A Network Case Manager can explain in more detail the eligibility requirements, and the specific ways this program can assist people living with HIV/AIDS.

The AIDS Education and Training Center (AETC) links academic and medical institutions and expert HIV clinicians in its region to the community. Training is preferentially targeted to providers who serve minority populations, the homeless, rural communities, incarcerated persons, and Ryan White Care Act funded sites. The goal of the AETC is to improve the care of people living with HIV/AIDS by providing education, training, clinical consultation and other forms of decision support for clinicians serving the targeted population.

Columbus Public Health offers a wide diversity of health services to the residents of Columbus and Franklin County. The clinical services include immunizations, a Tuberculosis clinic, dental care, alcohol and drug rehabilitation, health care, home care, WIC, prenatal care and a Sexual Health Clinic. Call 614-645-7417 for more information. The Columbus Public Health is dedicated to addressing sexual health related needs in the community. The Sexual Health program offers offsite and clinical sexual health services including confidential testing for HIV and other sexually transmitted diseases (for testing info call **614-645-7772**). The Clinic also has an Early Intervention Program offering case management services to clients newly diagnosed with HIV. The Early Intervention Program

Case Manager can assist individuals with both information and services. To reach the Case Manager call **614-645-6993**.

The Columbus AIDS Task Force is a comprehensive AIDS services organization dedicated to preventing the spread of HIV and serving those who live with HIV. CATF offers prevention, education and training programs to individuals, groups and organizations throughout Central Ohio. The agency also has a resource library and is home to the Ohio HIV/AIDS/STD Hotline. The Client Services Department provides case management, housing, access to primary care (in both Central and Southeast Ohio) and behavioral health services to people living with HIV/AIDS. CATF can help clients with: food pantry, pet program, community referrals, financial assistance, support groups, chemical dependency treatment, housing, back to work issues, and counseling. CATF also has volunteer opportunities available. Call The Columbus AIDS Task Force at **614-299-2437** for more information or for case manager services.

Southeast Inc., has HIV/STD Prevention Education, case management and counseling services. The agency has Mental Health and Chemical Dependency Recovery services including specialized services for gay, lesbian, bisexual, and transgendered adults. A prevention service is also available to gay, lesbian, bisexual, and transgendered youth. Call Southeast at **614-444-0800, ext. 2240** for more information.

The Licking County AIDS Task Force (LCATF), The Woodlands, offers both HIV Prevention Education and HIV Case Management Services. Case Management Services include assistance in the following areas: support services, housing, primary care, financial assistance and food pantry. LCATF provides case management services through the HIV Case Management Network and serves people living with HIV disease in Delaware, Fairfield, Licking and eastern Franklin counties. The Ohio AIDS Coalition is a statewide advocacy group for people living with HIV and AIDS. OAC sponsors the annual Leadership Conference for people living with HIV/AIDS and professionals working in the field of HIV disease. OAC also conducts Healing Weekends throughout Ohio for people living with HIV/AIDS and publishes a bi-monthly newsletter called the *Wellness Times*. The Ohio Department of Health, HIV CARE Services Section works with local efforts ensure the effective delivery of services for people living with HIV/AIDS throughout Ohio. ODH/ACRS oversees a variety of programs to assist those living with HIV/AIDS.

- Ohio Drug Assistance Program (OHDAP) offers people with limited income the ability to receive HIV related medications. A case manager can assist with the application.
- Health Insurance Premium Payment (HIPP) Program assists qualified people to pay their monthly health insurance premium. The application for the HIPP Program is the same as the OHDAP application. A case manager can assist with the application.
- Case managers funded by ODH/ACRS are located around Ohio to ensure all people living with HIV/AIDS have access to needed services from the state and local communities.

Central Ohio HIV Consortium Client Services
Access Guidelines Funding Year 16
March 31, 2007 – March 30, 2008

RW assistance is limited to individuals living with the HIV disease who are experiencing an HIV-Related Emergency. An HIV-Related Emergency is defined as: An unexpected situation that is either caused by or negatively impacts the client's HIV status and there is no other resource available to provide the needed service.

Guidelines are determined by members of the Ryan White Consortium (consumers and those working in the field of HIV/AIDS care) and are subject to change. Emergency funding is contingent upon availability of funds. Guidelines are reviewed periodically in order to better meet the needs of consumers in the Central Ohio region.

Note: All services need to be pre-approved by a RW Case Manager prior to the date of service.

Assistance is determined by, but not limited to:

- Each request for services will be evaluated on a case-by-case basis and will assure that the RW program is the payer of last resort
- Assistance is based on the availability of funds (funds are monitored monthly and adjusted as necessary).

Once eligibility and necessity are determined, services may be approved under the categories of services listed below.

Medical-Related Emergency Needs:

HIV Medical Services/Diagnostics and Monitoring

- Follow ODH guidelines; HIV-related medical visits and care: associated lab costs according to national standards of care.
- Cannot be used for hospital inpatient, emergency room, urgent care or ambulatory surgical procedures. OHDAP formulary medications cannot be purchased without exception from OHDAP; no vitamins.
- Specific medical and pharmaceutical co-pays may be eligible.
- Chiropractic care with documentation from HIV or primary care physician verifying HIV-related need **and** approval from the Ohio Department of Health. Must be documented emergency. Determined on a case by case basis.
- Genotype and Phenotype testing must be pre-approved by the Ohio Department of Health by exception only.

Substance Abuse

- On a case-by-case basis, by exception only.
- Approval will be based on outpatient substance abuse treatment if timely access to treatment and counseling is not available.
- Funds may not be used for inpatient detoxification in a hospital setting.
- If detoxification is offered in a separate licensed residential setting (including a separately licensed detoxification facility within the walls of a hospital), CARE Act funds may be used for this activity.
- If the residential treatment service is in a facility that primarily provides inpatient medical or psychiatric care, the component providing the drug and/or alcohol treatment must be separately licensed for that purpose.

Mental Health

- If local MH community resources are unavailable, may refer to other mental health services to provide client with up to 6 emergency stabilization visits per year, with no more than 3 visits at a time.

- Sessions over 6 will need to be approved via exception to ODH/HCS.

Dental

- Dental Services to include cleanings, semi annual exams, X-Rays.
- Fillings and extractions by approved treatment plan.
- Treatment plans over \$500 must be pre-approved via the exception process to ODH/HCS.

Health-Related Emergency Needs:

Housing/Utilities:

- All housing related expenses to be paid from HOPWA funds. Housing is not a RW category. Clients are expected to have a housing plan to cover expenses beyond emergency episode.

Transportation

- Emergency transportation may be in the form of a day bus pass, gas voucher, or another available option. Assistance limited to HIV-related medical, dental, mental health, or public assistance appointments in emergency situation.

Rehabilitation

- Physical therapy, adaptive equipment.
- Co-pays on these services when needed.

Medical Supplies

Medical supplies to include gloves, pads, incontinence supplies.

Nutrition

- Food vouchers: Maximum of 2 food vouchers per year based on emergency situation and determined on a case by case basis.
- Home-delivered meals: Up to a 3-month emergency supply per client per year. Only available for those unable to prepare or access nutritious meals (exceptions made on approval).
- Liquid Nutritional Supplements: Limited to Boost; available only through Project Open Hand Columbus for an amount to be determined as a result of nutritional assessment and/or orders from Doctor.
- Nutritional Assessments: Based on need and available funding.

Family Services and Child Welfare

Provides for short term child welfare and family services such as:

- Emergency supplies (diapers, some medical supplies)
- Short respite care
- Bereavement counseling for infected clients
- Individual and family mental health crisis counseling - up to 6 visits
- Childcare provided by a licensed provider or facility
- Health Insurance Premium (HIP) (1 per year only)
- Attendance at Healing Weekend (1 per lifetime)

Ohio Ryan White Consortia Grievance Procedure

All grievances must be in writing on the Ohio Grievance form. Grievances must be filed within the current fiscal year (April 1 through March 31st) or up to 60 days after the close of the fiscal year. Grievances should be mailed to:

1. Grievant completes an Ohio Ryan White Title II Grievance form which can be obtained from any Ryan White funded case-manager or by contacting the Ohio Department of Health Consortia Coordinator, Nichole Robinson at **1-800-777-4775**.
2. The completed form should be mailed to the attention of the Grievance Committee at the address utilized for consortia business.
3. The Consortia Coordinator will obtain the grievance and deliver the sealed grievance to the Consortia Chair.
4. Within five business days, the Consortia Chair will assign a number to the grievance to retain anonymity and acknowledge receipt of the grievance in writing to the grievant. A copy of this response will be sent to the Ohio Department of Health Consortia Coordinator and the fiduciary agency. All communication regarding the grievance will be referred to by the assigned number while in discussion with the Grievance Committee, Consortia, and fiduciary agency.
5. The Consortia Grievance Committee will review the grievance within two weeks of receipt and make a recommendation to the consortia by the next scheduled consortia meeting.
6. Consortia membership will vote on a resolution to the grievance within two consecutive meetings. Meeting minutes should reflect discussion of the recommendation and response to the grievance. If further research is needed to resolve a grievance, Consortia Chair will notify ODH Consortia Coordinator and fiduciary agency for assistance and possible resolution.
7. The Chair will notify the Grievant, ODH, and fiduciary agency in writing once a decision has been made.
8. A copy of all grievances must be retained by the Consortia Chair/Coordinator in a secured, locked location for a period of 12 months from the date of receipt.

SSI/SSDI INFORMATION

Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) pays cash benefits to people who are unable to work for a year or more because of a disability. You can receive SSDI benefits at any age. A Person with HIV/AIDS does not always qualify for Social Security Disability, for more information call the Social Security Administration.

Supplemental Security Income (SSI) is a program run by Social Security. It pays monthly checks to the elderly, the blind, and people with disabilities who don't own many things or have much income. If you get SSI, you may be able to get Medicaid, food stamps, or some other social services.

MEDICAID / MEDICARE INFORMATION

(adapted from Office of Ohio Health Plans Fact Sheet)

OVERVIEW

The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) administers Medicare, the nation's largest health insurance program, which covers nearly 40 million Americans. Medicare is a Health Insurance Program for people 65 years of age and older, some disabled people under 65 years of age, and people with End-Stage Renal Disease (permanent kidney failure treated with dialysis or a transplant).

WHAT IS MEDICAID?

Medicaid is a state and federally funded health care coverage plan providing health care coverage to certain low income and medically vulnerable people of all ages.

HOW DO CONSUMERS RECEIVE MEDICAID SERVICES?

Medicaid provides primary and acute care services through a fee-for-service system or, for consumers in some areas, managed care plans. Both delivery systems provide all medically necessary primary care, specialty and emergency care, and preventative services.

Ohio Medicaid also provides both home health care and facility based services for those consumers requiring a long term care benefit package. Ohio's home care services allow consumers to remain in their homes and communities.

WHAT SERVICES DOES MEDICAID COVER?

Ohio's Medicaid program includes services mandated by the federal government as well as optional services Ohio has elected to provide. Some services are limited by dollar amount, number of visits per year, or setting in which they can be provided. With some exceptions, all services are available as medically necessary to all Medicaid consumers.

Services include:

Transportation to Medicaid services, Medical and surgical dental services, Durable medical equipment and supplies, Family planning services and supplies, Home health services, Inpatient hospital services, Lab and x-ray services, Medicare premium assistance, Nursing facility care, Nurse midwife, certified family practitioner, Outpatient services including those provided by Rural Health Clinics and Federally Qualified Health Centers, Physician services, Medical and surgical vision services, Ambulance/ambulate services, Chiropractic services for children only, Community alcohol and drug addiction treatment, Dental services, Hospice care, Physical Therapy, Occupational Therapy, Speech Therapy, Podiatry, Prescription Drugs, Independent psychologist services for children only, Vision care, including eyeglasses.

HOW DO I APPLY FOR MEDICAID?

The Department of Job and Family Services (DJFS) administers a variety of county, state and federal financial, medical, and social service programs. Those interested in applying for Medicaid or other assistance programs will need to contact the DJFS office closest to where they live. Call first for an appointment.

HOW DOES MEDICARE PRESCRIPTION DRUG COVERAGE WORK?

Your decision about Medicare prescription drug coverage depends on the kind of health care coverage you have now. There are two ways to get Medicare prescription drug coverage. You can join a Medicare prescription drug plan or you can join a Medicare Advantage Plan or other Medicare Health Plans that offer drug coverage.

Whatever plan you choose, Medicare drug coverage will help you by covering brand-name and generic drugs at pharmacies that are convenient for you.

Like other insurance, if you join, you will pay a monthly premium, which varies by plan, and a yearly deductible (no more than \$250 in 2006). You will also pay a part of the cost of your prescriptions, including a co-payment or coinsurance. Costs will vary depending on which drug plan you choose. Some plans may offer more coverage and additional drugs for a higher monthly premium. If you have limited income and resources, and you qualify for extra help, you may not have to pay a premium or deductible. WHY SHOULD I GET MEDICARE PRESCRIPTION DRUG COVERAGE?

Medicare prescription drug coverage provides greater peace of mind by protecting you from unexpected drug expenses. Even if you don't use a lot of prescription drugs now, you should still consider joining. As we age, most people need prescription drugs to stay healthy. For most people, joining now means protecting yourself from unexpected prescription drug bills in the future.

WHAT IF I HAVE LIMITED INCOME AND RESOURCES?

There is extra help for people with limited income and resources. Almost 1 in 3 people with Medicare will qualify for extra help and Medicare will pay for almost all of their prescription drug costs. PREVENTION RESOURCES

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's new initiative, Advancing HIV Prevention: New Strategies for a Changing Epidemic is aimed at reducing barriers to early diagnosis of HIV infection and, if positive, increasing access to quality medical care, treatment, and ongoing prevention services. The initiative emphasizes the use of proven public health approaches to reduce the incidence and spread of disease. As with other sexually transmitted diseases (STDs) or any other public health concern, principles applied to prevent disease and its spread will be used, including appropriate routine screening, identification of new cases, partner counseling and referral services, and increased availability of sustained treatment and prevention services for those infected.

The next decade promises new hope as three primary areas of HIV prevention are emphasized:

- Early detection of persons who are HIV positive and referral to care services
- Prevention interventions with persons living with HIV
- Prevention with persons who are at high risk for HIV infection

Locally, Federal HIV prevention dollars are used for HIV rapid testing, funding mandated partner counseling and referral services and HIV prevention case management, facilitating the Columbus Regional Advisory Group (CRAG), and providing grants to local CBO's for HIV prevention programs. The traditional line between HIV care and HIV prevention has blurred. CARE Act dollars are now used for prevention services such as HIV testing and Federal Prevention dollars are now mandated to be used for services for HIV infected individuals.

Central Ohio HIV Care and Prevention agencies have a long tradition of working collaboratively in an effort to combat HIV. This section provides a listing of many of the HIV Prevention services in the region.
